✓ Enhances vocabulary, expression, and listening skills.

3. Cognitive Development: Shape, Number, or Alphabet Puzzles

- Cut out puzzles using cardboard or foam sheets.
- Focus on matching, sorting, and sequencing activities.

✓ Builds memory, logic, and recognition.

4. Social & Emotional Development: Role Play Props

- Create simple props for doctor, shopkeeper, or cooking play.
- Use paper, cloth, and recycled items.

✓ Encourages empathy, sharing, and social skills.

5. Sensory Development: Texture or Sound Boxes

- Fill boxes with items of different textures (soft, rough, smooth) or sounds (bells, rice, paper).

✓ Supports exploration and sensory stimulation.

- 3+ play materials (handmade), clearly labeled.
- A short description (5–6 lines) under each:
 - What it is
 - How to use it
 - Which domain it supports
- Photos of making and final product.
